SUBJECT: Daily inspection of tailplane installation

BACKGROUND: One half of a tailplane has been lost in flight. (German AD 82-121 refers).

ACTION REQUIRED:

1. Before next flight

Insert in the Flight and Service Manual SALTO, issue December 72 on page 4 after the section "Tail Rigging".

"Prior to each takeoff check the tail unit for tight position by a slap against the tail unit leading edge and verify that the loop of the safety pin is correctly located in the U-bow and contacts the "screw head".

2. Endorse part one of the Maintenance Release
"Check tailplane Assy to AD 240 on each Daily Inspection".

3. <u>D.I. Book</u>

Copy of AD 240 to be attached to the current and subsequent Daily Inspection Books.

4. Optional modification

Incorporation of a modification to Item 2 of Technical Note 101-21 (Ursula Hanle) removes the need for actions 1,2,3, above, which can be cancelled following incorporation.

IMPLEMENTATION:

- (1) Actions (1), (2), (3) to be completed by Owner/Operator.
- (2) Daily inspections to be carried out by GFA authorised Daily Inspectors.
- (3) Action 4 to be carried out by the holder of a DoT. 1109, endorsed 'C. of A. GRP". Modification to be detailed in the gliders log book.

COMPLIANCE:

The requirements of this Airworthiness Directive are mandatory. This Directive is issued pursuant to Air Navigation Regulations delegated by the Secretary of the Department of Aviation.
